The Archives of Edinburgh College of Art and other institutions that merged into the University of Edinburgh, such as Moray House, have potential for further research. Edinburgh College of Art had studios in the area of the synagogue on Graham Street and later built near/ on that site. We also know that there were eastern Europeans that came to study at the college from the 1930s and through World War II who could have been Jewish. Researching individuals would mean looking through record books, fee books or staff records and then linking with other sources as the college did not note the religion of their students or staff.
